<u>A Word about Cultivars:</u> Whenever possible it is best to use the original species of a native plant. By definition a cultivar has been cultivated by man. If our goal is to rebuild & support healthy habitats, using the straight species is the most reliable choice. Research on cultivars is in the early stages & is ongoing. Often if the chemistry of a plant changes too much (as in leaf color change) the cultivated plant will offer little or no ecological services - such as being available as a host plant or providing pollen or nectar for pollinators. Mimicking nature as closely as possible is our best hope of rebuilding thriving ecosystems.

A Word about Cultivars: Whenever possible it is best to use the original species of a native plant. By definition a cultivar has been cultivated by man. If our goal is to rebuild & support healthy habitats, using the straight species is the most reliable choice. Research on cultivars is in the early stages & is ongoing. Often if the chemistry of a plant changes too much (as in leaf color change) the cultivated plant will offer little or no ecological services - such as being available as a host plant or providing pollen or nectar for pollinators. Mimicking nature as closely as possible is our best hope of rebuilding thriving ecosystems.
